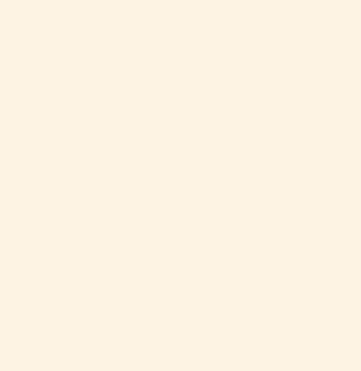
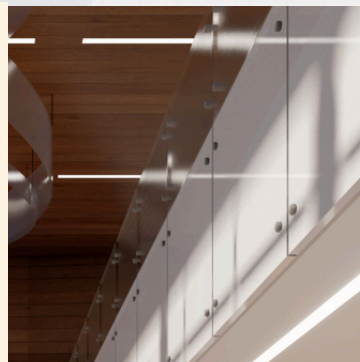

We have made meaningful strides in strengthening access to high quality patient-centred care. Across the organization, teams worked diligently to improve patient experiences, implementing surveys and improving patient flow, including reducing wait times in the Emergency Department. As we look ahead, we remain focused on building on our progress and strengthening regional hospital partnerships to enhance care and delivery in the right place at the right time.

These accomplishments and milestones would not have been possible without the dedication and resilience of our staff, physicians/professional staff, volunteers and community partners. Message from the Chief of Staff and VP Clinical Services & Chief Nursing Executive

Our clinical teams of staff and physicians/professional staff work around the clock to ensure that our patients and community are cared for with a professional, compassionate approach.

Over this past year, there have been a significant amount of clinical advancements and innovations that have been implemented, while our hospital has progressed through redevelopment construction phases and introduced new leadership. We're proud of what has been accomplished during a time of such change and revitalization.

In October 2025, SMH in partnership with Southlake Health, upgraded its electronic medical record system (Meditech), through its Computerized Provider Order Management (CPOM) launch, creating efficiencies and enhancing patient safety. A significant amount of training was completed by nursing, clerical and physician/professional staff teams to ensure the launch was successful.

In the spring of 2026, SMH implemented new Zoll defibrillators and Omnicell pharmacy cabinets, further ensuring that the latest equipment and technology are used for the benefit of safe and efficient patient care. We continued to invest in the future of healthcare through the enhancement of our clinical Nursing Extern Program, as well as our resident and medical student preceptor training program. By expanding opportunities for nursing, residents and medical students to gain hands-on experience within our hospital, we have strengthened our workforce while providing valuable mentorship and learning experiences that support the next generation of healthcare providers.

Recruitment and physician leadership development remained a key priority. We were pleased to welcome new and returning physician Chiefs in Radiology and Anaesthesia who bring exceptional expertise, leadership, and a shared commitment to clinical excellence.

We thank our staff and physicians/professional staff for their dedication to patient care, as well as our volunteers, donors, and community partners for your unwavering support of our hospital.

As we look ahead, we remain focused on advancing quality, safety and innovation in our clinical health care practices. We are excited about our bright future and will continue to build on our progress to meet the evolving needs of our growing community.

The Nursing Float Team has expanded thanks to the work of this team, which is a significant support to SMH in patient care. Our Nursing Extern Program continues to grow as part of this new team, which has been successful in helping recruit new nurses for the organization.

Our Human Resources Department has a newly recruited team that has enhanced Scheduling within the organization. With added hours within the week and on Saturdays, staff scheduling has become more streamlined for the organization in support of SMH's Leadership Team.

Our Professional Practice team ensures that our nursing and allied health staff have all of the tools they need to deliver high quality, safe patient care daily.

Care

30th Anniversary of Dialysis Program and Midwifery at SMH

On April 2, 2026, SMH celebrated 30 years since the inception of its Dialysis program. Patients and families, Dialysis staff, SMH leadership, hospital partners and local dignitaries gathered to celebrate the special milestone. SMH's Dialysis program operates as a satellite site of Royal Victoria Regional Health Centre's (RVH's) Regional Renal Program. In the 30 years of the program's existence, over 100,000 dialysis visits/treatments have been completed at SMH.

On May 5, 2026, International Day of the Midwife, SMH celebrated a 30-year partnership with the Alliston Midwives – Caring Hands Midwifery Services. Members of the original midwifery team, as well as clients and families, SMH midwifery staff, SMH leadership, hospital partners and local dignitaries gathered this week to celebrate. In 30 years of the program's existence, close to 5,000 births have been delivered by the midwifery team at SMH.



Omnicell Cabinet Implementation

In March 2026, the Pharmacy Team launched new Omnicell XT Cabinets within the organization, which are automated medication dispensing systems. Aligned with our Meditech electronic medical records system, they securely store, track, and dispense medications and medical supplies at the point of care. They enhance inventory control, reduce errors, and streamline workflows for nurses and pharmacy staff. A significant amount of planning and training went into the successful launch of the Omnicell Cabinets.

Zoll Defibrillator Launch

In May 2026, SMH successfully implemented new Zoll Defibrillators to ensure the highest standards of patient care were being met across the organization. They are a leading device in critical care, providing real-time and audible feedback during chest compressions. With this new implementation, SMH aims to improve the quality of resuscitation efforts, increase successful outcomes in emergency situations. SMH's Professional Practice Team lead the staff training program in partnership with Zoll.

Rapid Assessment Zone (RAZ) Launch

SMH officially launched its Rapid Assessment Zone (RAZ) in the Emergency Department on April 21, 2026. The RAZ is a designated area within our ED space designed to reduce wait times for those experiencing minor ailments or less critical needs, such as sprains, cough/colds, sore throat & upper respiratory needs, stitches, earaches & infections, and more.



This initiative supports SMH's goals to meet the needs of the growing community and enhance the overall patient experience in the Emergency Department.

"We are offering the Rapid Assessment Zone to expedite care for patients with minor ailments, so that they can receive the care they need and return home sooner," says Dr. Oswaldo Ramirez, Chief, Emergency Department. "We have created the RAZ for our community to access safe, high-quality care, quickly and efficiently."

Partnerships

SMH would like to recognize and thank the following hospital partners for their support and guidance over the 2025/26 year:

Royal Victoria Regional Health Centre (RVH)

RVH provided executive leadership support in providing both an Interim VP Clinical Services as well as Interim Chief Nursing Executive. RVH also provided Human Resources oversight and guidance, as well as recruitment support.

SMH also became a part of RVH's regional support in Patient Experience as well as Privacy and policy management. RVH also provided a Manager of Professional Practice to support the build of our nursing float team, as well as enhance clinical education and practices.

Southlake Health

Southlake Health continues to partner with SMH regarding Information Technology (IT) support. They provide after-hours support with their Help Desk phone line as well as onsite tech support when needed. SMH and Southlake Health co-launched the Computerized Provider Orders Management initiative in October, 2025. Southlake Health also provides support in our Allied Health areas, in particular Laboratory Services in receiving samples for testing when additional support is needed.

Orillia Soldiers' Memorial Hospital (OSMH)

Over the past year, OSMH provided Human Resources support with the recruitment of some of our executive leadership positions. This included the VP Clinical Services and CNE role, as well as VP Corporate Services and Chief Financial Officer. OSMH also provided enhanced Scheduling support to update and realign our nursing schedules to meet the organization's needs.

Regional Partnership – CT Relocation

One of the most significant projects that took place to prepare for the construction of our new facility was the move of our CT Suite. It was moved to a new repurposed space in the hospital in February 2026, as the original space was being removed to accommodate the new facility build.

With seven days of downtime without a CT scanner, SMH partnered with local hospitals in the region to ensure continuity of care for our patients. Any patient in need of CT services during our downtime was transported to a local facility. Dedicated transportation was arranged, including a nurse to accompany the patient during transport.

Thank you to the following local hospitals for their support in providing CTs to our patients during the relocation project timeframe:

Collingwood General & Marine Hospital, Georgian Bay General Hospital, Headwaters Health Care Centre, Orillia Soldiers' Memorial Hospital, Royal Victoria Regional Health Centre and Southlake Health.

Unique to Simcoe County, this partnership was unprecedented and created the care pathway needed for 22 patients to be transferred to receive urgent CTs. With the planning and coordination of this initiative, no hospital received more than two patients in a day to help minimize impact across the region.

We are very thankful for the support of our local hospitals and EMS services during this timeframe for our community. This was a successful initiative focusing on regional hospital partnerships to provide care for patients in need.

Mental Health Partnership – SMH, Nottawasaga OPP & SHIFT

Our mental health nurse lead in SMH's Emergency Department has strengthened our partnership with the Nottawasaga OPP and SHIFT in relation to mental health patients. This initiative helps care for our community's most vulnerable patients, strengthening a team approach to responding to mental health crisis situations. Increased conversations and planning are part of this initiative to improve outcomes for mental health patients overall in our community.



“We're very grateful to have these community partners. They're often the first point of contact in the community with patients, and by the time they arrive to us, there's already a rapport built and there's valuable contact already within that patient relationship. So in order to continue that collaboration in the emergency room, we share information, we coordinate care and we make sure that the transition into hospital care is as smooth as possible.”

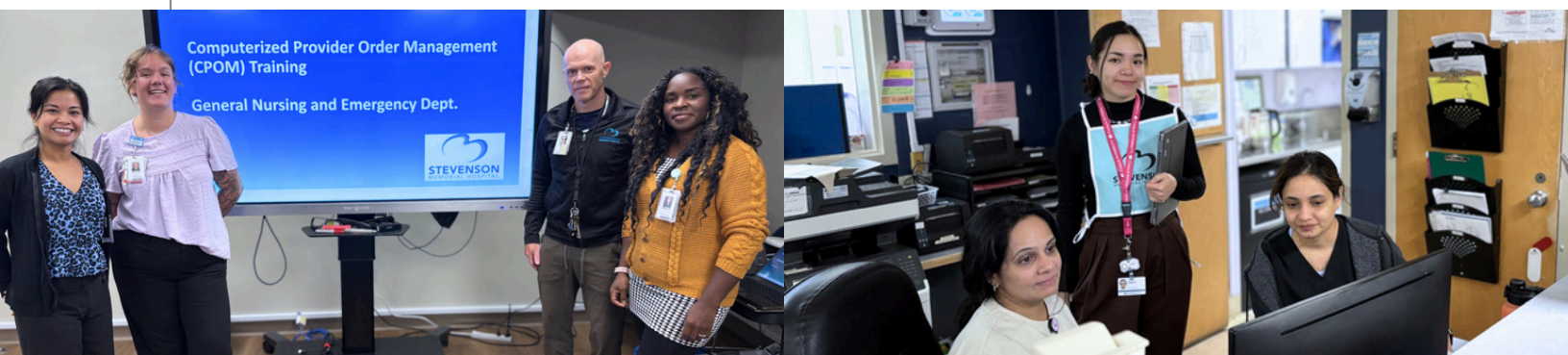

Investments

Advancing Technology & Infrastructure

CPOM Launch

In October, 2025 SMH in partnership with Southlake Health launched CPOM – computerized provider order management. This was a significant transition from mostly paper-based processes to an electronic system for patient charts, supporting more streamlined, coordinated care. As a result, patients benefit from improved communication between care teams and enhanced safeguards designed to support patient safety. An extensive amount of planning, training and testing was involved with our clinical teams for this important launch.



Sectra PACS Launch

In May 2026, SMH in partnership with Southlake Health upgraded its diagnostic imaging technology and launched Sectra PACS for imaging review and PACS-related workflows. Designed with a modern, intuitive interface, Sectra supports more streamlined workflows, improved image accessibility, and a more integrated user experience for clinical teams.

IT Updates

In alignment with our CPOM launch, SMH also moved from MModal over to Dragon DMO dictation, receiving positive feedback from physicians and professional staff. SMH has also migrated from Windows 10 to Windows 11 on frontline Tap and Go workstations and are working through physical workstations and laptops to provide the same update.

To enhance our cyber security safety, SMH implemented Proofpoint, which provides advanced email protection. SMH is also rolling out ORDR, which is our network asset discovery solution and gives visibility into every device that connects to SMH's internal network, showing any risks or vulnerabilities they may pose.

Facilities Update – New Generator

In the 2025/26 year, SMH received over \$430,000 in HIRF (Hospital Infrastructure Renewal Fund) and CIRF (Community Infrastructure Renewal Fund) funding from the provincial government. This contributed to the upgrade for a new emergency generator for the hospital. SMH is very grateful for the ongoing support from the Government of Ontario. Infrastructure funding helps the hospital maintain its current facility while construction is underway for the new facility.

Redevelopment Updates

Pomerleau Inc. Awarded Contract

In January 2026, Stevenson Memorial Hospital, in partnership with the Ontario government and Infrastructure Ontario, awarded Pomerleau Inc. the contract to construct the new SMH hospital facility. This key milestone advanced the redevelopment project, moving it into the next phase as planning transitioned toward construction. Once complete, the new facility will more than double the size of the existing hospital and provide modern, purpose-built spaces to better serve patients, families, staff, and the broader community.

The redevelopment will include a significantly expanded Emergency Department, enhanced Diagnostic Imaging services with new equipment including an MRI suite, expanded inpatient units with single-occupancy rooms, and new Obstetrics and surgical spaces designed to support growing regional needs.

Groundbreaking Marks the Start of Construction on New Hospital

In March 2026, SMH, in partnership with the provincial government, Infrastructure Ontario, and general contractor Pomerleau Inc., officially marked the start of construction on the new expanded hospital facility. The milestone was celebrated with an on-site groundbreaking ceremony attended by project partners and dignitaries, including the Premier of Ontario and the Deputy Premier and Minister of Health.

Construction of the new 147,100 square-foot facility is now underway on the hospital site, with the project scheduled for completion in late 2028. Once complete, the new hospital will significantly enhance care capacity and services for the region.



Message from the SMH Auxiliary

This year, our volunteers provided over 10,000 hours of support for the Hospital. We currently have 95 active volunteers, including 21 student volunteers. If you know of an area within the Hospital that you feel could benefit from volunteer presence, please contact us.

Treasures & Treats again had a very successful year, generating gross revenue of approximately \$100,000 during the fiscal year. The Treasures & Treats team works very hard to keep the look of the shop fresh and inviting, regularly introducing new items for sale. The new POS system has now been in operation for the full fiscal year and has proven to be a valuable tool, simplifying all our ordering and accounting functions.

The information desk ("Welcome Center") located by the main entrance has seven-day coverage, provided by both our adult and student volunteers. The Med/Surg and Emergency Departments are staffed by volunteers five days a week. This year, we expanded our in-hospital volunteer program to include Diagnostic Imaging, which is also now covered five days a week.

At our regular members' meeting held in March, we presented the SMH Foundation with a cheque for \$40,000, fulfilling the pledge made earlier in the year. The SMH Auxiliary and the SMH Foundation work closely to promote awareness and support for our Hospital. The SMH Auxiliary attends 12-15 community events every year. These events are primarily a fundraiser but are also a great opportunity to talk to people about our community Hospital. There is a very strong interest in what is going on with our redevelopment project and our services.

Our outdoor fundraising season runs from April through November and starts with the Tottenham Artisan & Home Show. We will participate in an additional 12-15 events throughout the summer, with the season concluding with our annual raffle draw in November. The fundraising focus for the 2025-26 fiscal year was a portable X-ray unit. Looking ahead to 2026-27, we have selected a Giraffe Incubator for the Obstetrics Department. All the proceeds of our fundraising activities, both inside and outside, go towards the purchase of equipment identified by the Hospital as needed.

Our Annual Meeting is scheduled for June 24, 2026, and the Auxiliary welcomes Marnie Lightfoot, SMH Chief Nursing Executive, as our guest speaker. As the academic year comes to a close, we will be saying goodbye to some of our student volunteers and look forward to recognizing two outstanding student volunteers with bursaries to support their future educational pursuits.

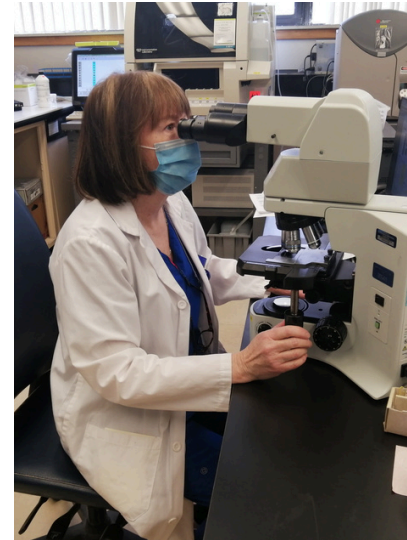

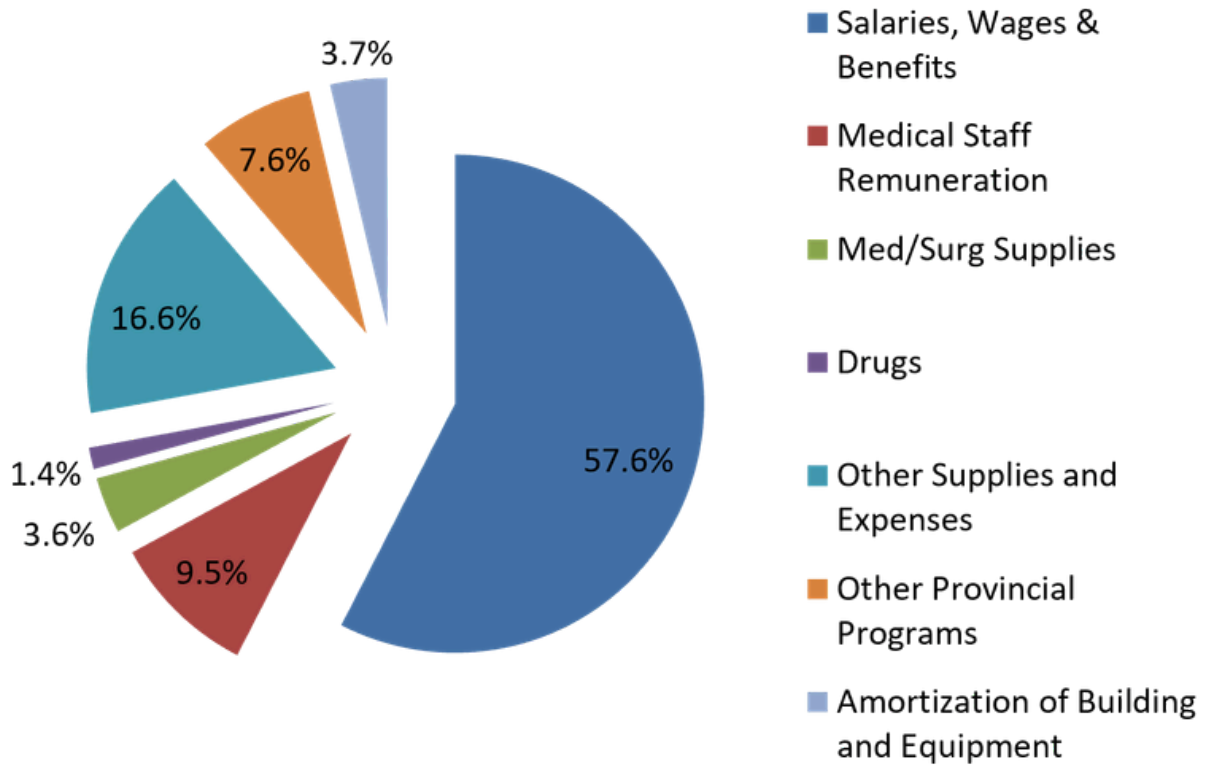

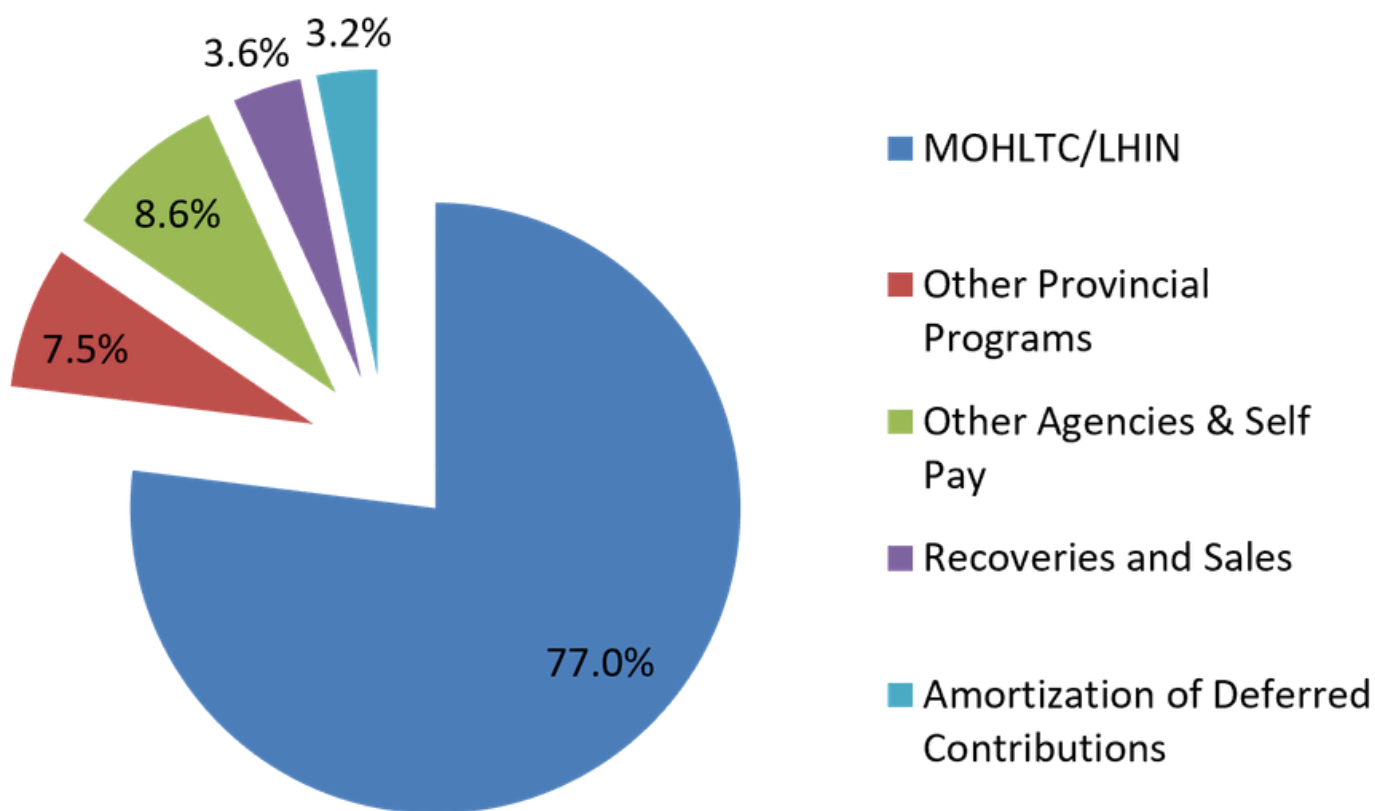

Message from the Foundation Board Chair and CEO

Dear Valued Members of our community,

This has been a year of progress. After years of planning, vision, and the steadfast generosity of our community, progress became something we could finally see and stand beside. On March 9, we proudly celebrated an historic ground-breaking ceremony at Stevenson Memorial Hospital, alongside Premier Doug Ford. That incredible moment marked a significant step forward for our shared vision of enhancing care for our growing community. Seeing so many of our dedicated supporters there was a powerful reminder of exactly what we are building together.

That same momentum carried through every corner of the Foundation. We expanded and strengthened our team, welcomed a growing circle of volunteers, and saw community involvement flourish through more third-party events than ever before. In the fall of 2025, we celebrated together at the Energy Event, our well-attended signature gala — a night that captured the spirit of a community rallying behind its hospital.

Because of YOU, our capital campaign, reached \$43 million toward our \$80 million goal. Every gift, every event, and every act of advocacy has brought us closer to a future where exceptional care stays close to home. This year, the Foundation generated total revenue of \$4,052,437. This represents support that translates directly into better care for our patients. Because of donors, the hospital was able to purchase new infant warmers for the obstetrics department, ensuring our youngest patients are cared for from their very first moments. And as the fiscal year drew to a close, we were honoured by an unprecedented commitment from the Morningview Foundation: a \$3 million matching gift over the next three years (which has since been increased to \$4 million) that will multiply the impact of every donation to come.

None of this progress happens in isolation. Over the past year, the Foundation has grown into a more supportive and collaborative partnership with our Board of Directors, while the power of our volunteers and third-party events has given us a positive and pervasive presence throughout Alliston and the surrounding South Simcoe communities we are so proud to call home.

In 2028, Stevenson Memorial Hospital will celebrate 100 years of caring for this community — the very year our new facility is expected to be substantially complete. We invite you to stay engaged and walk this final stretch with us.

None of this progress would be possible without your kindness, trust, and generosity as the lifeblood of the Stevenson Memorial Hospital Foundation. Together we are building a healthier future for every patient, family, and neighbour we serve.



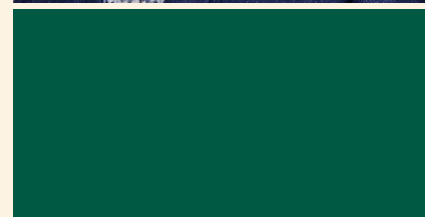
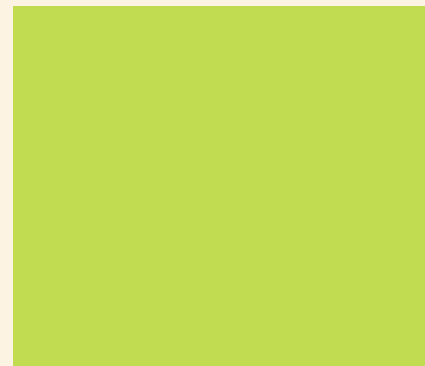

Stevenson Memorial requires approximately \$405 million to expand our facilities and bring in the necessary new equipment, while simultaneously ensuring ongoing equipment needs are met. The **Because of YOU** campaign aims to raise \$80 million to meet our local share and maintain on-going capital & equipment needs of the Hospital. 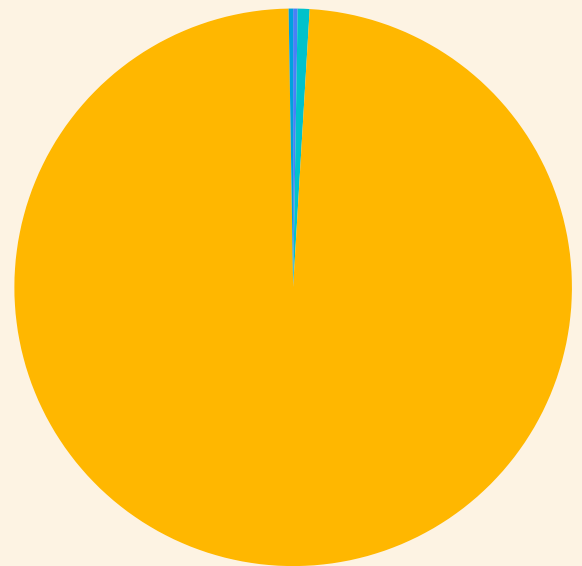

We respectfully acknowledge that the land on which Stevenson Memorial Hospital and the Foundation reside is the traditional territory of the Anishinaabek Nation.

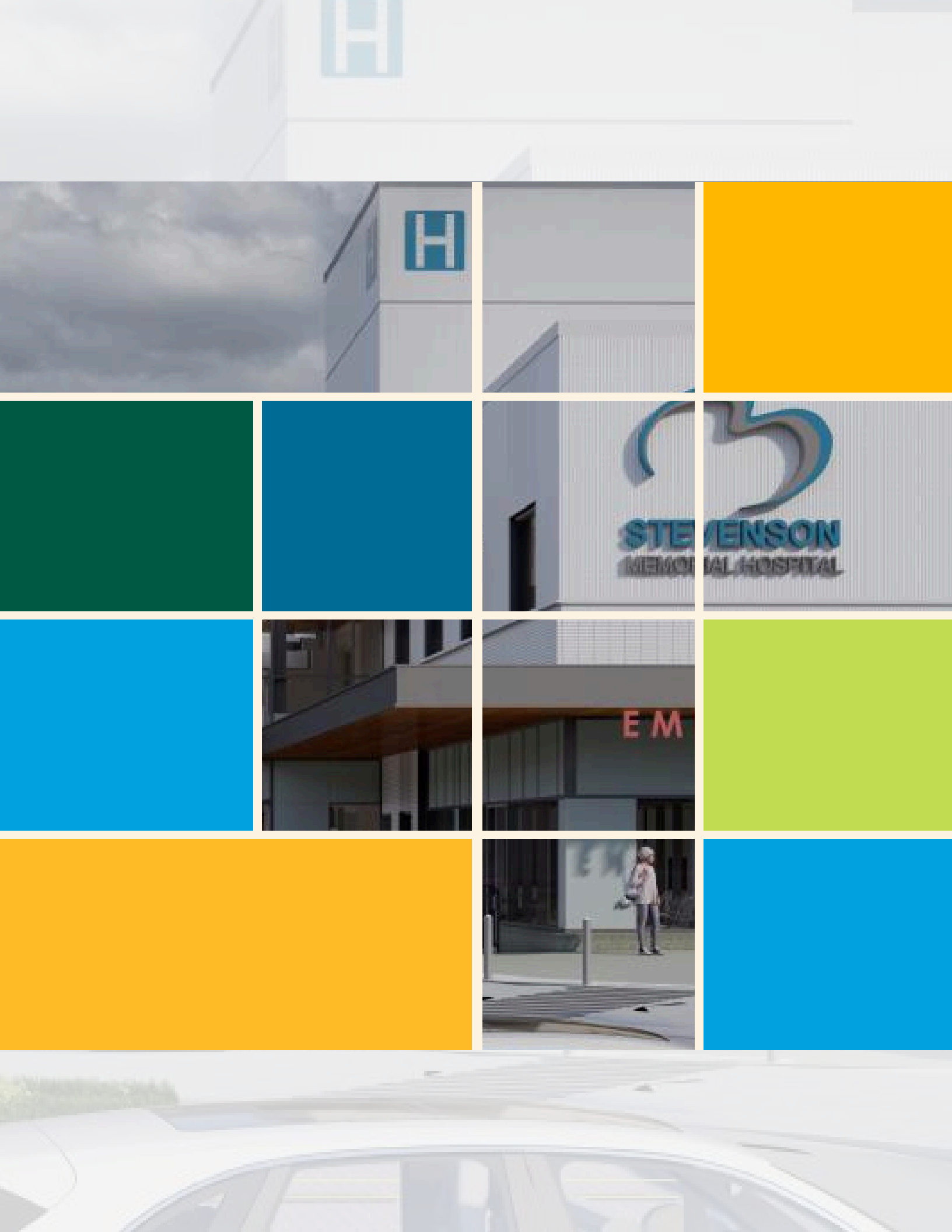
